Attending with Mayor Casebolt were Recorder Rita Cox, Ward 1 Councilwoman Donna Boggs, Ward 2 Councilman Bill Racer, Ward 3 Councilwoman Laurie Elkins, Ward 4 Councilman Michael Hill, Councilmen at Large John Montgomery, Bill Javins and Andy Shamblin, City Attorney Johnnie Brown, and City Treasurer John Young.

INVOCATION/PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE: The Invocation was given by Councilman Shamblin and the Pledge of Allegiance was led by Councilman Javins.

FUTURE DATES OF COUNCIL: Mayor Casebolt said the future dates of Council are May 1 and May 15.

APPROVAL OF COUNCIL MINUTES: RECORDER COX MADE THE MOTION THAT THE MINUTES OF APRIL 3 BE APPROVED WITH A SECOND BY COUNCILMAN MONTGOMERY. THE MOTION CARRIED.

OLD BUSINESS

WHEREAS natural, technological, and man-made hazards can affect City of Nitro; and

WHEREAS significant structural, historical, and economic losses could result from an occurrence of a natural, technological, or man-made hazard events; and

WHEREAS undertaking mitigation projects during pre-disaster periods could decrease the total losses Nitro incurs as a result of said hazard occurrences.

THEREFORE the Nitro City Council has partnered with the county to update the existing Region 3 Hazard Mitigation Plan, adopted in 2012, in an effort to further identify, define, and characterize the hazards affecting the city as well as to continue identifying and prioritizing projects that could lessen hazard vulnerability.

WHEREAS the Nitro City Council has a strong interest in reducing losses from future hazard occurrences; and

WHEREAS the hazard mitigation plan is a federal and state requirement to maintain eligibility for hazard mitigation funding, and, by that requirement, must be updated a minimum of every five (5) years; and

WHEREAS a cooperative, joint effort is a proven, efficient way to plan for and reduce hazard susceptibility in all government jurisdictions served by the Region 3 Planning & Development Council.

THEREFORE the City of Nitro joined the Region 3 Planning & Development Council in the completion of this plan update.

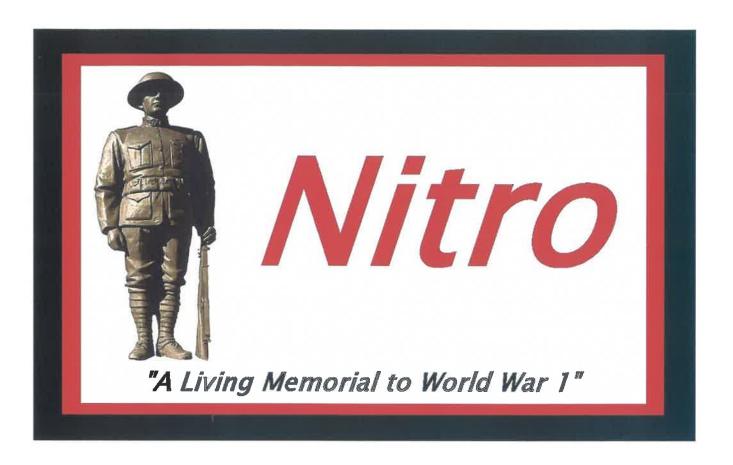
