RECOGNIZING THE IMPORTANCE OF THE 2020 CENSUS PROCLAMATION OF SUPPORT

WHEREAS, The United States Constitution mandates that a census be conducted every ten years in Article I, Section II.

WHEREAS, the first census took place in 1790 and there have been 22 national censuses taken since with the next census scheduled for 2020 and

WHEREAS, the Bureau of the Census in the United States Department of Commerce is responsible for conducting the census and federal government is charged with funding the cost of the census and

WHEREAS, it takes the cooperation and investment of states and locals governments working in conjunction with the federal government to ensure that the census is fully executed and represents a complete and accurate count of the people within each jurisdiction and

WHEREAS, the results of the census are the foundation for many important decisions made by federal and state government, including the disbursement of federal funds to states based on population and

WHEREAS, it will take the collaboration of community leaders, faith leader, non-profits, and state and local governments to raise the public's awareness of the importance of the census and to find ways to support the census efforts

NOW THEREFORE:

BE IT PROCLAIMED that the City of Nitro, WV recognizes the importance of the decennial census and commits to preparing all community members for the 2020 census.

BE IT FURTHER PROCLAIMED that the City of Nitro, WV will partner with the US Census and will work with the community leaders including representatives from faith based and nonprofit organizations, education, business, and social services, as well as representatives of local governments and others from historically undercounted populations in the jurisdiction to ensure that the City of Nitro, WV residents are properly and fully counted in the 2020 census.
