There being no objections or corrections minutes were declared approved as read.

Recorder read to council Financial Statement of city for month of May, 1936.

Mayor Cooper called for report of Committees:

Councilman Scott reporting for committee on sanitation reported no complaints filed and sanitation in good condition.

Street Commissioner Kessel reported that some work had been done on certain streets during month of May.

Mayor Cooper called councils attention to condition of sewer line running out of 40th. Street hollow, stating that owing to the fact that this sewer line was not connected with any city sewer that refuse was being run out on ground and into creek causing a very unsanitary condition of which residents of that section of town were making complaints.

Councilmam Putney suggested that a committee be appointed to investigate the condition of 40th. Street sewer and approximate cost of repairing same.

Mayor Cooper appointed the following members of council as the

committee: Councilman Scott, Putney and Kessel.

Councilman Putney entered motion that the matter of repairing sewer be taken up with the PWA; motion seconded by councilman Scott and upon vote by council was declared carried.

The matter of insurance premium due on Fire Engine was placed before the council. Councilman Lintzmeyer entered motion that Treasurer draw order on the City treasuary in payment of amount due, motion seconded by councilman Putney and upon vote by council was declared carried.

The matter of more police protection was brought to councils attention. Councilman Putney entered motion that a committee be appointed to take up this matter with the Business Mens Association asking them to assist City in the payment of wages of a special policeman. These letters have been placed in the city files.

Mayor Cooper called for the members of council to express their views on this matter and then called on several citizens present to give their opinion. After considerable discussion by members of council and citizens councilman Smith entered motion that a committee be appointed to make an investigation of all sanitary conditions, committee to report back at the next regular session of council. The Mayor called for reading of minutes of regular session of council held on the 6th. day of October and minutes of special meeting held on the 20th. day of October, 1936.

There being no objections or corrections minutes were declared approved as read.

The Recorder read the Financial Statement for month of October, 1936.

Mayor Cooper called for report of committees: Councilman Putney reported for committee on sanitation and stated that no investigation had been made yet in regard to the proposed ordinance governing the keeping and raising of hogs within the city limits but that the members of committee had talked the matter over and still had it under consideration and would possibly take some action in the matter at the regular session of the council on January 5, 1937.

The Recerder stated to council that E. M. Merriell, United States Government Engineer had visited the office a few days previous to this meeting and that Mr. Merriel wished the council to know that his department were working on a plan to take care of the city sewerage, he also stated that they expected to fill the Locks at Winfield on July 1, 1937, and that he or other members of the Engineering Department would get in touch with the city council in the near futures.

Mayor Gooper read copy of letter to council that he had written to L. S. Emery, Assistant Superintendent, New York Central Railroad, Charleston, West Virginia, letter written by request of council in regard to the dangerous condition of crossings at Eighteen Street and at Forty-second Street, said letter beging that the railway company take action in installation of signal lights at these particular crossings, and letter received in reply under date of October 16, stating that the railway officials had this matter under investigation, and letter under date of October 24, 1936, stating that while they appreciated the position of the council in wanting to elimanate the element of danger at these crossings their survey of the conditions existing at the present time indicate that these crossings could scarsely be considered dangerous if motorists would exercise a reasonable care and caution and under these circumstances the railway company did not feel that the installation of signal lights were warranted at this time. These letters have been placed in the files of the city.

Mayor Cooper reported to council of damage suit pending, the plaintiff being Mrs, Vera B. Weese vs The City of Nitro; West Virginia water service Company and the Weaver Crane and Trucking Company. Mayor Cooper stated to council that he understood that the Weaver Crane and Trucking Company would assume all responsibility for damages and in all probability the suit would be settled out of court.

Mayor Cooper read letter to council received from C. C. Knapp, letter complaining of bad condition of sidewalk on First Avenue, at Thirty-ninth Street, and his reply to said letter. Letter and copy of answer have been placed in the city files. No action was taken by council at this time in regard to this matter.

The Mayor called the councils attention to WAA project, known as Sponsors Proposal No. 1; purpose of project grading and terracing First Avenue; surfacing South Twenty-first Street and installing a twenty-four inch culvert across Twenty-first Street in the High School Area, stating to council that the amount of \$1075.00 before application of project would be approved.

After some discussion on this matter councilman Putney entered motion that a special meeting be called and that property owners on South Twenty-first Street be notified to attend this meeting to discuss with members of council concerning this project, motion-seconded by councilman Smith and upon vote by council was declared carried.

The new rates on street lights was brought to councils attention by Mayor Cooper who read letter received from W. F. Ficklen, Manager, Appalachian Electric Power Company, also statement outlining new rates.

The following resolution was placed before the council for their

approval:

"Resolved: That the City of Nitro accept the new rates on street lights as presented by the Appalachian Electric Power Company, and effective as of November 1, 1936."

Motion for adoption of resolution made by councilman Smith, seconded by councilman Naldorf, and upon vote by council was declared carried.

A letter from the Civic Benifits Association, J. E. Hulshizer, Secretary, protesting the removal of fire hydrants in the Plant Area, without first consulting those concerned was read to council by Mayor Cooper and the Mayor's reply to same, these letters have been placed in the city files.

A recommendation was offered to council by the Recorder, object being to solve to a certain extent the special police problem and the enforcement of city ordinances at all times, as follows:

1st. That all special officers who are under oath be instructed that they are expected to act at all times when violation of any city ordinance is brought to their attention regardless of whether they are on regular duty or not.

2nd. That special officers shall be paid 50% for each arrest made whether conviction in case is found or not, this amount to be paid in addition to the regular fee of \$1.00 when conviction is found in case and fine and costs are paid.

A motion was entered by councilman Smith that the above recommendation be adopted, seconded by councilman Putney and upon vote by council was declared carried.

There being no further business to come before the council at this time a motion to adjourn carried. Meeting adjourned.

Those speaking in favor of erecting a city building were: Mrs. C. E. Smith, Mrs. Thos. Bartram, Mr. G. C. Alderson, Mr. J. C.

Jordan and councilman Putney.

Mr. Alderson that if the town of Nitro was ever going to do anything that now was the time and suggested that Mayor Cooper appoint a committee of business men to act in conjunction with the city council and that they should make a thorough investigation and ascertain what the citizens wanted in regard to a city building and how much the building would cost.

Mr. Jordan suggested that there should be a more concrete plan drawn up by a committee appointed to work with the city council.

Mr. I. E. Ellis, Fire Chief, spoke of the town extending more to the Southern end of town in future years and stated that in his opinion the city building should be in the lower end of town and built to house the fire department as well as for other purposes.

Councilman Putney stated that now was the logical time for the town to build a city building so that the town would have the advantage of obtaining 45% of the cost from the PWA.

Mr, Chas. E. Roe spoke very much in disfavor of building a city building, stating that a city building was not needed at this time.

A motion was made and seconded that Mayor Cooper appoint a committee to act with the city council. Motion carried.

Mayor Cooper attempted to appoint a committee from those present but failed to get the desired number, it was then agreed that the Mayor should appoint a committee at a later date.

Mayor Cooper called for reading of minutes of regular session of council held on the 14th. day of December, 1937. There being no objections or corrections minutes were declared approved as read.

Mayor Cooper called for reading of Financial Statement of City for month of December, 1937.

Mayor Cooper advised council of additional expenditures for month of January, especially in regard to new parts for fire-truck and the necessary cost of labor in fixing truck, advised council that the City had been promised aid by the Civic Benefits Association in this matter. Also advised council of the temporary closing of Forty-first street and the probable closing of Twenty-ninth Street.

M. A. Bender, City Engineer, addressed the council in regard to the sewers of Nitro, calling their attention to the danger which already exists to a number of families from sewer gas and that in a short space of time that the entire population of Nitro would be endangered, he spoke of being in touch with the Government Engineers ever since this matter first came up and of the co-operation by all concerned that had been given the Government Engineers but had obtained but very little, if any, satisfaction in regard to this matter, he said he had been advised that a meeting would be held between January 1, and 10th. 1938, but he had heard nothing more about it and meeting had not been held.

Mr. Bender proceeded to read letter to council in regard to sewers, copies of which were to be sent to the following:
Hen. Louis A. Johnson, Assistant Secretary of War;
Hon. M. M. Neely, United States Senator; Hon. Rush D. Holt,
United States Senator; Hon. Joseph L. Smith, United States
Congressman; Hon. George W. Johnson, United States Congressman; and Andrew A. Payne, President of the Nitro Industrial
Corporation.

Committees on sanitation and street lights reported everything O. K.

Councilman Putney reported that he thought some residents below Forty-second Street would be glad to pay for fire protection so that they might obtain lower insurance rates on their property. This matter tabled until the next meeting.

# January 11, 1938. Cont'd.

Mayor Cooper brought to councils attention the few donations that had been made by merchants to help defray the expense of an extra policeman. After a short discussion it was decided that the majority of merchants were not in favor of paying a monthly fee and ruled that the amounts that had been collected be returned.

There being no further business to come before the council a motion to adjourn carried. Meetingadjourned.

whereas, the City of Nitre, West Virginia, has aquired ewnership of all the trunk line sewers and mains in the sewer system constructed in and upon the property at Nitro in Putnam and Kanawha Counties, West Virginia, formerly owned by the United States of America and known as the "Nitro Reservation", with the right to enter upon the premises where the same are located at all times to construct, relocate, keep, repair and maintain the same, and being the same sewer system and interest therein which was conveyed to the Nitro Sewer Company by the Nitro Industrial Corporation by deed dated July 1, 1937, recorded in the office of the Clerk of the County Court of Putnam County, West Virginia, in Deed Book at page \_\_\_\_\_, and recorded in the office of the Clerk of the

County Court of Kanawha County, West Virginia, in Deed Book \_\_\_\_\_ at page \_\_\_\_, and,

WHEREAS, the City of Nitro, West Virginia, has employed J. E. Settle, Consulting Engineer, to make a complete survey and report of its sewer system, streets, avenues and alleys, together with plans and profiles, so as to ascertain definitely the exact amount of replacement, repair and relocation that will be necessary to its sewer system, streets, alleys and public buildings, by reason of the increased pool elevation resulting from said locks and dam, which said survey and report has been completed, and,

WHEREAS, copies of said survey, report, plans and profiles have been filed with, and approved by the West Virginia State Health Commissioner and the Sanitary Engineer for the State of West Virginia, and,

BE IT RESOLVED, THEREFORE: That the City of Nitro, West Virginia, does hereby execute the following offer to the United States of America, that is to say:

The City of Nitre, a municipal corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of West Virginia, situate in Kanawha and Putnam Counties, having control and jurisdiction over certain sewer lines, structures, lands, easements, privileges and appurtenances thereunto belonging, as described below,

DOES HEREBY, for the consideration hereinafter mentioned, offer and agree to sell and convey unto the United States of America, or its assigns, the perpetual easement and right to flood, as may be necessary due to the construction, maintenance and operation of the Winfield Locks and Dam across the Kanawha River,

In report of committees councilman Stamm reported that Mr. Mollohan of the Electric Company advised him that the additional street light between 22nd and 23rd Streets on Third Ave. would be placed in the best position possible for the benifit of residents living in that vicinity.

The question of burning trash along First Avenue was again brought before the Council. Mayor Schowen advised Council that no drastic steps would be taken in this matter until after clean up week, possibly first week of April.

Councilman Hayes read to Council Ordinance No. 39, said ordinance governing the disposal of trash. Councilman Rimmer entered motion that Ordinance No. 39 be enforced, motion seconded by councilman Stamm and upon vote by Council was declared carried.

Councilman Rimmer reported bad condition existing on 21st Street which brought a general discussion of bad conditions existing on other streets.

The Recorder read to Council letter addressed to the SECRETARY OF STATE, said letter offering for purchase bonds known as "THE TOWN OF NITRO STREET IMPROVEMENT BONDS".

Councilman Rimmer entered motion that letter be copied in minutes of this meeting, motion seconded by councilman Stamm and upon vote by Council was declared carried.

The letter reads as follows:

Councilman Hayes entered motion that the City Treasurer be allowed a salary of \$25.00 per month, effective as of April 1, 1939, motion seconded by councilman Waldorf and upon vote by Council was declared carried.

Meeting adjourned.

- C. F. Schowen, Mayor, T. A. Lewis, Recorder, and

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Schowen who explained to Council that object of meeting was that Mr. J. B. Alderson, Area Supervisior, WPA, has requested that the Council reconsider the release of streets as given to the WPA office under date of June 3, 1939, and asks that they rearrange the releases, as moving equipment from one end of the town to the other for one street at a time incurs too much expense to the WPA.

### August 30, 1939.

The council of the City of Nitro held a special session on the 30th day of August, 1939, present were:

C. F. Schowen, Mayor, T. A. Lewis, Recorder, and

Herman Jones, J. E. Waldorf, G. F. Hayes, members of said council, also present were Dale G. Casto and C. H. Hetzel, representatives of the Sleepy Hollow Estate.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Schowen, who stated to council that meeting had been called for the purpose of discussing with Mr. Casto and Mr. Hetzel the addition to the City of Nitro of properties of which Mr. Casto and Mr. Hetzel were representatives, said property known as the Nitro Golf Course and adjoining property. Mr. Casto and Mr. Hetzel called attention to the houseing problem which confronts Nitro at present, and increase in employment in the Plant Area, the loss to the business men of Nitro by reason of men employed at the plants having to live in adjoining towns.

After considerable discussion between the members of council present and Mr. Casto and Mr. Hetzel the members of council agreed to cooperate to any reasonable extent in regard to this matter and as no definite action could be taken at this time a motion for adjournment carried.

The Meeting was called to order by Mayor Schowen.

The Mayor called for reading of minutes of regular session of council held on the 9th day of August, and special sessions of council held on the 15th; 22nd; and 30th days of August. 1939. There being no objections or corrections minutes were declared approved as read.

The Recorder read to council financial statements of City for month of August, 1939, of the General Funds and the Street Improvement Fund.

In reporting for committees councilman Jones reported that the sidewalks at school building had been repaired. Councilman Waldorf reported that the work that was being done on Third Avenue was almost completed.

Councilman Hayes entered motion that Mr. Casto leave map of the Sleepy Hollow Estate with M. A. Bender, City Engineer, that he might examine said map after which he was to report back to the council at a later date of his findings, and at which time the council would give this matter further consideration and decide on the feaseability of taking into the corporate limits the above mentioned property. Motion seconded by councilman Jones and upon vote by council was declared carried.

The Recorder read letter to council under date of September 6, 1939, letter being from the Public Works Administration, Washington, D. C., and signed by E. W. Clark, Acting Commissioner of Public Works, said letter being in RE to PWA Project No. 1166, Nitro Sewers, West Virginia; this letter has been placed in files of City.

The Recorder presented to council the following petitions:

18th Street from First Avenue to Second Avenue, Curb & gutter, 33rd Street from First Avenue to Second Avenue, Curb & gutter, 21st Street from Second Avenue to Blakes Creek Bridge, Curb & gutter. 21st Street from First Avenue to Blakes Creek Bridge, Paving.

The Recorder presented to council application of Project No. 620-1175, application providing for improvement of streets by excavation, grading, draining, placing curb and gutter, stone base and surface materials and performing any other incadental and appurtenant work in connection therewith, also provides operation of quarries in or near Nitro to produce materials for use on the project.

Councilman Hayes entered motion that application be accepted and Mayor Schowen be authorized to sign same, motion seconded by councilman Rimmer and upon vote by council was declared carried.

Councilman Hayes entered motion that the following improved streets be accepted:

24th Street from First Avenue to Second Avenue, Paving, 37th Street from First Avenue to Second Avenue, Paving, 33rd Street from First Avenue to Second Avenue, Paving, 18th Street from First Avenue to Second Avenue, Paving, Paving; also Second Avenue From 40th Street to 41st Street, Paving.

Motion seconded by councilman Rimmer and upon vote by council was declared carried.

Councilman Hayes entered motion that property owners on 24th Street and 37th Street, also property owners on Second Avenue from 40th Street to 41st Street, be granted Thirty days (30); and that property owners on 33rd Street and 18th Street, be granted Sixty (60) days, for the payment of paving assessments, dating from date of acceptance, September 13, 1939.

Motion seconded by councilman Rimmer and upon vote by council was declared carried.

Councilman Hayes entered motion that property owners abutting on Second Avenue, from 40th Street to 41st Street, be assessed 42¢ per front lineal foot; and that property owners abutting on 37th Street from First Avenue to Second Avenue, be assessed 46¢ per front lineal foot; and that property owners abutting on 24th Street, from First Avenue to Second Avenue, 33rd Street from First Avenue to Second Avenue, 18th Street from First Avenue to Second Avenue, be assessed 50¢ per front lineal foot, as evidenced by the City Engineers report, filed and accepted, this, the 13th day of September, 1939. Motion seconded by councilman Stamm and upon vote by council was declared carried.

Councilman Rimmer entered motion that petitions for installing curb and gutter on 18th Street, 33rd Street, and 21st Street, also petition for the completion of paving of 21st Street be accepted, motion seconded by councilman Waldorf and upon vote by council was declared carried.

It was suggested by the City Engineer that Mayor Schowen write the WPA office at Charleston asking that they release this work as soon as convenient.

There being no further business to come before the council at this time a motion for adjournment carried. Meeting adjourned.

Pettyjohn Company. Councilman Hayes entered motion that the City Engineer be authorized to secure one or more additional estimates for the forming and placing of reinforcing steel. Motion seconded by councilman Stamm and upon vote by council was declared carried.

The Recorder read letter to council under 1939, signed by John A. Dickson, Assistant Secretary of The West Virginia State Sinking Fund Commission, that the Sinking Fund Commission would need care of November 1, 1939, obligation on Town of Nitro Sinking Fund. Mr. Casto was called on to explain to council what the Land Company intended doing in regard to general construction, such as bridges, width of streets, drainage etc. After a discussion of this matter between the City Engineer, members of the council and Mr. Casto, it was agreed that Mr. Casto submit plans to the City Engineer in the next rew days.

The Recorder again read estimates on repairing 21st Street bridge submitted by The West Virginia Pipe Company and John P. Pettyjohn, also estimate submitted by R. L. Stover, these estimates have been placed in files of City.

Mayor Schowen offered plan to council to repair bridge by putting in a 3 inch wood floor, the City Engineer suggested placing strips of sheetiron on same for the tread of vehicles to run on, sheetiron to be bolted securely to the wood floor of bridge to eliminate any unnecessary noise or rattle.

Bond of John Rush, Patrolman, was presented to council. Councilman Rimmer entered motion that bond be accepted, motion seconded by councilman Stamm and upon vote by council was declared carried. Bond to be mailed to the County Clerk of Kanawha County to be recorded.

The Recorder read letter to council addressed to M. A. Bender, City Engineer, in RE to the Nitro Sewer System and the unsanitary condition that prevails in Nitro, letters being signed by the following: C. B. Marshall, M. D; J. W. Skaggs, M. D; A. W. Milhoan, M. D; L. I. Hoke, M. D; also copy of letter written by M. A. Bender, City Engineer, to the Hom. Geo. W. McClintic, Judge of the United States Court, Charleston, West Virginia, and answer by Judge McClintic to said letter. The aforementioned letters have been placed in files of City.

Mr. Bender advised council of his attendance at meeting of the Board of Condemmation Commissioners at Charleston in regard to the above mentioned, this meeting was still in progress at time of this meeting.

Recorder presented statement to council of membership dues for fiscal year 1939-1940 from the West Virginia League of Municipalities, amount of dues being \$28.00. Councilman Waldorf entered motion that the Recorder draw an order on the City Treasury in payment of the above amount, motion seconded by councilman Jones and upon vote by council was declared carried.

Councilman Rimmer entered motion that the following streets be released for paving:

Motion seconded by councilman Stamm and upon vote by council was declared carried.

There being no further business to come before the council at this time a motion for adjournment carried. Adjourned.

Councilman Rimmer called councils attention to bridge being built by the Nitro Land Company, stating that bridge was not very substantial, after discussing the matter of bridges, streets, sewers, draina ge etc. in that area councilman Hayes entered motion that a letter be written to Dale G. Casto, asking that he submit plans and specifications, as previously promised on November 1st relative to the development of subdivision at the head of 21st Street, not later than November 15th at which time council will meet at 7-30 P. M. at Nitro City Hall; if plans and specifications are not received by said date the City of Nitro will be forced to take legal steps to have work suspended untill such time as these conditions are complied with. Motion seconded by councilman Stamm and upon vote by council was declared carried.

M. A. Bender, City Engineer, reported that the Condemnation Commission had awarded to the Nitro Sewer Company the sum of \$174,000.00.

An ordinance governing vagrancy was read to council by the Recorder for the second reading. Councilman Stamm entered motion that ordinance be adopted as read, motion seconded by councilman Rimmer and upon vote by council was declared carried.

Application to the State Farm Mutual Automobile Insurance Company for insurance on the patrol car was presented to council. Councilman Rimmer entered motion that application for insurance be approved, motion seconded by councilman Stamm and upon vote by council was declared carried.

An agrrement between the City of Nitro, purchaser, and Criss and Shaver, seller, was presented to council by the Recorder; said agreement has been placed in files of city.

The Recorder presented statement of Black Top from the West Virginia Black Rock Company of Black Top delivered on 15th Street. Councilman Hayes entered motion that statement be referred to the City Engineer for verification and the West Virginia Black Rock Company be advised that the City be furnished with the original or duplicate tickets on all future deliveries, motion seconded by councilman Rimmer and upon vote by council was declared carried.

The matter of appointment of a member on the Zoning Commission to fill vacancy created by the expiration of H. N. Tinsleys term; the appointment of a Planning Board; and the instalation of signal lights at 21st Street and 2nd Avenue was discussed by council but no definite action taken in either matter.

Councilman Rimmer entered motion that meeting be declared in recess for 1 week, motion seconded by councilman Stamm and upon vote by council was declared carried.

### November 15, 1939.

After being in recess for 1 week the council of the City of Nitro assembled to-gether on the 15th day of November, to complete business left unfinished at the regular session of November 8, 1939, those present were:

C. F. Schowen, Mayor, T. A. Lewis, Recorder, and

J. H. Rimmer, G. F. Hayes, J. W. Stamm, members of council of said city and M. A. Bender, City Engineer.

Meeting called to order by Mayor Schowen.

Mayor Schowen submitted the name of M. A. Harmon as member of Zoning Commission to fill vacancy created by expiration of term of H. N. Tinsley. In the discussion which followed it was brought out that the proper procedure would be to appoint a Planning Board to take the place of the Zoning Commission.

Mr. Bender, City Engineer, read to council Section 11, Article 5, Chapter 8, Code of West Virginia, 1931. It was ruled by council to lay the appointment of a Planning Board over until the next regular meeting of the council.

The City Engineer presented blue prints and specifications of the Nitro Land Company to council; specifications on construction of streets as to width, rock base and top was deemed to be 0. K. by council, after some discussion concerning construction of bridges the council ruled that this matter be left up to Mr. Bender for his approval.

The Recorder presented to council prices submitted by the Valley Motor Service on wheels, tires and tubes for the Ford V8 truck. It was ruled by council to table purchase of these articles until further invest igation had been made regarding prices.

Councilman Rimmer entered motion that paving of 15th Street by the Works Progress Administration be accepted and that the property owners of said street be assessed 50¢ per front lineal foot and be grant ed 60 days (dating from November 15, 1939) in which to pay amount of assessment, motion seconded by councilman Stamm and upon vote by council was declared carried.

There being no further business to come before the council at this time a motion for adjournment carried. Meeting adjourned.

Meeting called to order by Mayor Schowen who called for the Recorder to read minutes of regular session of council held on the 8th day of November, and which was declared in recess until the 15th day of November, 1939.

There being no objections or corrections minutes were declared approved as read.

Recorder read financial statements of city for month of November, 1939, of the General Fund and the Street Improvement Fund.

After a discussion in regard to the use of the patrol car the council ruled that the car be left at the City Building at end of each shift and be used for police service only.

Councilman Rimmer entered motion that Recorder advise all Service Stations to allow no purchases to be charged to City unless they received a written order and signed by the Recorder, motion seconded by councilman Jones and upon vote by council was declared carried.

Councilman Jones reported to council of complaint by Henry Pauley of 29th Street that dirt taken from a basement was piled up so that he could not use his driveway.

Councilman Hayes reported of bad condition existing at Mr Poffs property, 37th Street, old county road. The City Engineer advised that there was ample room for repairing of road and opening of drainage.

The question of repairing 21st Street bridge was brought to councils attention by Mayor Schowen, who submitted a statement for oak flooring from the Southern Supply Company. Councilman Rimmer entered motion that the bridge be floor-

ed, motion seconded by councilman Hayes and upon vote by council was declared carried.

The Recorder advised council of complaint of Mrs John McCallister, 2812 - 28th Street, claiming that the WPA men had dug up the Shrubbery in her front yard and asked that it be replaced and that the driveway be opened up as it was before the paving of street.

Councilman Stamm entered motion that the United Fuel Gas Company be requested to install curb cut-off valves at each residence on 21st Street; also to install curb cut-off valves on all other streets where cut-off valves were inside of buildings, motion seconded by councilman Hayes and upon vote by council was declared carried.

The City Engineer reported to council of method now being used by the Nitro Land Company in regard to construction of bridges above 21st Street, stating that the Nitro Land Company had agreed to construct all bridges in that locality in the manner requested by the City Engineer.

Councilman Hayes entered motion that the Appalachian Electric Power Company be requested to install additional street lights at intersection of 31st Street and 2nd Avenue, motion seconded by councilman Rimmer and upon vote by council was declared carried.

The Recorder read the following letters to council:

Recorder read to council financial statement of the General Fund and statement of the Street Improvement Fund for month of January, 1940.

The matter of annexing a certain tract of land to the City of Mitro, owned by the Nitro Company, was brought before the council; Mr. Dale G. Casto proceeded to read the following Resolution to Council:

"On the 21st day of February, 1940, again came The Nitro Company, a corporation, the owner of a bract of land adjoining the corporate limits of the City of Nitro and filed before the Council a map showing said tract of land, and made proper showing before the Council that there was no dwelling houses on said tract of land, and no persons residing thereon, and moved the Council that said tract of land be taken into and made a part of the City of Nitro, in accordance with and pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 56, Acts of West Virginia Legislature Regular Session, 1937, being Section 591 (127) Michies' Code of West Virginia, 1937.

And it appearing to the Council of the City of Nitro, adjoining said premises sought to be taken in limits is as follows:

Beginning at a point in a notthern boundary line of The Nitro Company property, located at Blakes Creek Valley, the said point is located S. 83 24 E. 275 feet from a wild cherry corner in the original boundary line, wild cherry being the N.E. corner of the cemetary lot that fronts on the Blake Road, said point is also at the intersection of the eastern corporation line of the City of Nitro, with the northern boundary line of the Nitro Company property; thence with the eastern boundary line of the corporation of the City of Nitro S. 23 45 W. 430 feet, more or less to the angle point in said corporation line; thence with the southern boundary line of said

City of Nitro N. 66 15 W. 1,500 feet more or less, to a point where said corporation line intersects the northern boundary line of the said Nitro Company property, the said point being N. 81 38 W. 225 feet to a set stone, said stone being a monument in the Nitro Company property line.

Beginning at a point in the northern boundary line of the Nitro Company property where the eastern corporation line of the City of Nitro intersects said boundary line, said point is located S. 83 24 E. 275 feet, more or less from a wild cherry corner at the N.E. corner of the Dudding Cemetary; thence leaving said corporation line of the City of Nitro and with the northern boundary line of the Nitro Company property, S. 83 24 E. 1,167.8 feet to a stone corner in said boundary line; thence leaving said northern boundary line of said property due S. 1,314.56 feet to a point in the southern boundary line of said property, where the southern side line of Langley Place intersects said boundary line; thence with said southern boundary line N. 83 33 W. 2,461.8 feet crossing Blake Creek to a walnut tree on the northern hill-side, being a corner of said Nitro Company property; thence leaving said southern boundary line N. 3 56 W. 1,372.8 feet to a point in the northern boundary line of said Nitro Company property, where the southern corporation line of the City of Nitro intersects said line.

And it further appearing that if said tract of land is taken in and made a part of the City of Nitro, that the corporate limits of the City of Nitro would be as shown in the paragraph last above.

And it further appearing to the Council of the City of Nitro that the courses, distances and areas, as above setforth have all been verified and approved by M. A. Bender, City Engineer, of the City of Nitro, as evidenced by his letter filed herewith and which letter is in the following words and to the following effect:

I have made examination of the map submitted by the Nitro Company of the tract of land adjoining the present corporate boundary line of the City of Nitro, and I verify and approve the calls and distances on said map, and recommend to the Council of the City of Nitro that the same be taken into and made a part of the said City of Nitro.

and that the Nitro Company, a corporation, will, at its own expense, take all such necessary and proper steps to properly present the matter of annexation of said territory to the Circuit Court of Kanawha County, West Virginia, it is ordered that said proposed annexation be approved by the Council of the City of Nitro, and that Kay, Casto & Amos, Attorneys for The Nitro Company, a corporation, be authorized and directed to proceed in the name of the City of Nitro, a municipal corporation, to annex such territory to the City of Nitro, in accordance with the provisions of the law as made and provided, but at the expense of the Nitro Company. And that shall be done by virtue hereof the Engineer of the said City of Nitro shall make report to the Council.

It is further ordered that Kay, Casto & Amos, Attorneys for said Company, make report to this Council what they shall do by reason of this resolution.

Recorder read to council recomendation from C. R. Connor, City Engineer, in regard to acceptance of Curbing and Guttering of 18th Street, and the Paving of 17th Street from 1st Avenue to 2nd Avenue.

Councilman Keener entered motion that recommendation be accepted, motion seconded by councilman Ellis and upon vote by council was declared carried.

Councilman Ellis entered motion that Mrs. W. M. Greer be reembursed for money paid by Mr. Greer on his policemans uniform, motion seconded by councilman Keener and upon vote by council was declared carried.

At this time Mayor Chapman declared the meeting in recess until August 29, 1940.

The council met on the 29th day of August, to continue meeting recessed on August 20th; all members being present the meeting was called to order by Mayor Chapman.

The question of ordinance governing barbers and beautici-

ans was again brought before council.

Councilman Ellis entered motion that ordinance be taken from table and opened for further discussion. After discussing ordinance for a considerable time during which V. T. Baker and Miss Bernice Parkins had their names cancelled on petition in favor of ordinance and placed on petition against ordinance.

Councilman Keener entered motion that petitions be ruled out and suggested that barbers and beauticians get to-gether and try and come to a satisfactory understanding as to closing hours, motion seconded by councilman Pauley and upon vote by council was declared carried.

Recorder read to council petition signed by 98 citizens of Nitro, petitioning the Common Council of the City of Nitro to investigate the water rates now charged in Nitro and vivinity by the West Virginia Water Service Company, there was no immediate action taken by council in regard to this matter.

A statement to the City of Mitro from M. A. Bender, former City Engineer, to amount of \$40.00, for the making of maps for the Land Company, was presented to council for approval of payment. Councilman Keener objected to payment of this account, after some discussion by members of council and in which discussion it was brought out that the City would be reembursed

for the aforesaid amount by the Land Company, councilman Ellis entered motion that the City Treasurer be authorized to draw an order on the City Treasury in payment of this account whenever there were available funds to do so, motion seconded by councilman Reynolds, upon vote by the council the following voted for payment: Ellis; Reynolds; Pauley and Draper, against payment: Reener, motion declared carried.

Meeting again declared in recess by Mayor Chapman until September 3, 1940.

The council met on the 3rd day of September, 1940, to continue unfinished business left over from recessed meeting of August 29th.

All members were present except T. A. Lewis, Recorder, and councilman proceeded to act as Recorder.

Meeting called to order by Mayor Chapman who stated to council that the first matter to come up before the council was an ordinance governing the improvement of streets and avenues within the City as follows:

√ 16th Street from 1st Avenue to 2nd Avenue, grading and paying " Blakes Creek, 30 th2nd 3rd Avenue lower or north side of llth Street to lower or north side of 15th Street, grading and paving from 21st Street to 31st Street, grading and " 3rd 1st Avenue to 2nd Avenue, grading, paving, √ 34th Street curbing and guttering √ 22nd lst 2nd Avenue, grading, paving, curbing and guttering √ 36th " 2nd Aven ue, grading, paving, lst curbing and guttering √ 30th lst 2nd Avenue, grading, paving, curbing and gubtering /20th lst 2nd Avenue, grading, paving, curbing and guttering √13th 2nd 3rd Avenue, curbing and guttering only  $\sqrt{15}$ th 2nd 3rd Avenue, curbing and guttering only √17th lst 2nd curbing and guttering only √3lst lst 2nd curbing and guttering only.

The ordinance was introduced and read to council and will be presented for second reading at the regular session of council to held September 17, 1940.

Councilman Reynolds entered motion that City take a Census of Mitro, there being no second motion died.

There being no further business to come before the council at this time a motion for adjournment carried. Meeting adjourned.

Some citizens residing on Third Avenue between 21st Street and 31st Street, who attended this meeting called councils attention to the bad condition of Third Avenue, and asked that they be shown some consideration when work was resumed by the W. P. A. The council agreed to do everything possible to remedy this matter.

The Council and City Attorney discussed changes to be made in the Building Code.

Councilman Ellis introduced an ordinance to amend and reenact Sections 2 and 22 of the Building Code.

Councilman Pauley reported of bad condition existing at 2901-03 29th Street. Hayor Chapman said he would see the owner, Otmer Harrison, in regard to this matter and have him to correct it.

Recorder read to council bid from the West Virginia Black Rock Company for material to be used in street improvements.

Councilman Ellis entered motion that meeting be recessed until November 25, 1940, at which time council would consider the bid submitted by the above named company, motion seconded by councilman Pauley and upon vote by council was declared carried, meeting declared in recess until November 25, 1940.

### Gentlemen:

The street lighting contract between the City of Nitro and the Appalachian Electric Power Company expires March 5, 1945, however, the Appalachian Electric Power Company has filed a reduced schedule of street lighting prices with the Public Service Commission of West Virginia, effective with service rendered in January, 1941, and we are willing to modify the contract with the City of Mitro and substitute the following street lighting prices for those listed in the contract between the Appalachian Electric Power Company and the City of Mitro, dated March 5, 1935.

The reduced prices apply only to existing facilities that have been installed since the execution of your contract.

## December 19, 1940, Cont'd.

71 80 C.P. Lamps @ 1.20 each per nonth

The same quantity and prompt payment discounts will apply as under the present contract.

If all discounts are taken these new prices would have affected a savings, based on your Hovember street lighting bill, of \$6.96 per month.

If this offer is acceptable to you and your Council, we will be pleased if you will have the Council pass a short resolution indicating its acceptance of this modification of the contract.

The report of I. E. Ellis, Fire Chief, of fires, visits to all business places during the year beginning January 1, and ending December 31, 1940, was read to council by the Recorder.

Councilman Draper reported to council that property owners on 16th Street were complaining of street being out of commission.

criticisms in regard to the police department, in the discussion which followed it was brought out that the money allocated for the current fiscal year for salaries, wages and general upkeep of the police department was insufficient to continue the personnel of the department for balance of fiscal year as of former months of year.

Councilman Keener entered motion that owing to insufficient funds that the services of the extra patrolman be discontinued for the present, motion seconded by councilman Pauley and upon vote by council was declared carried.

Councilman Keener entered motion that Karl C. Sharp, whose application had been presented and filed previously, be appointed as Police Chief, effective as of February 1, 1941, motion seconded by councilman Draper and upon vote by council was declared carried.

After some discussion by Mayor Chapman, members of council, and the City Attorney in regard to the State Highway between Nitro and Charleston the following resolution was offered:

"Whereas the present state highway between the City of Nitro and the City of Charleston is wholly inadequate to carry the heavy traffic which use this highway, and

Whereas, said highway is not only inadequate from a traffic standpoint but also is highly dangerous from the standpoint of safety in view of the numerous railroad crossings, manuevers

of the right-of-way, curves and bottlenecks, and

Whereas, the area between the City of Nitro and the City of Charleston is rapidly growing in population, demanding a better highway to serve said area, and

Whereas, other cities, farther down the Kanawha Valley and Communities served by said highway are likewise interested in and know of the very urgent need of a better highway for said area, and

Now, therefore, be it resolved by the Common Council of the City of Nitro, that it is the opinion of said Council that the State Road Commission take immediate steps to build and construct a better highway between said cities of Nitro and Charleston.

And, it is further resolved that a copy of this resolution be sent to the State Road Commission and to Governor M. M. Neely.

Councilman Draper entered motion that Resolution be adopted, motion seconded by councilman Keener and upon vote by Council was declared carried by a unamious vote.

There being no further business to come before the council at this time a motion for adjournment carried.

Meeting adjourned.

Petitions approved by council and further ruled that an ordinance be presented at the meeting of February 28, 1941.

Letter was read to council from the State Road Commission which has been placed in files of City.

Contract between the City of Nitro vs Noah Adkins in RE to purchase of rock for rock basing of streets was read to council. Councilman Keener entered motion that contract be approved, motion seconded by councilman Reynolds and upon vote by council was declared carried.

Councilman Keener entered motion that the bill presented by the Charleston Daily Mail relative to Bond Issue advertising to amount of \$39.60, payment of which was a ssumed by Chas. A. Brown, by reason of his error in drawing up the instrument and who at the time of publication was City Attorney for the City of Nitro, be paid at such time as funds are available, and that suit be instituted against said Chas. A. Brown for recovery of above amount, motion seconded by and upon vote by council was declared carried.

The question of closing hours for pool-rooms was refered to the City Attorney.

After some discussion by council about dogs running loose Mayor Chapman read to council the ordinance known as the dog ordinance.

Councilman Ellis presented an ordinance governing traffic which he read to council, there were some provisions objected to by councilman Keener, Councilman Ellis entered motion that ordinance be tabled, motion seconded by councilman Draper and upon vote by council was declared carried.

Bond of Karl C. Sharp, Police Chief, read to council, after some discussion it was ruled to table bond until some investigation had been made of bondsmen.

It was suggested by Mayor Chapman that he have a parking sign placed below the Valley Motor Service Station at the west corner of the Nitro Theatre, this was approved by council.

Councilman Keener presented an ordinance for the correction of Ordinance No. 47, adopted by council on the 9th day of August, 1939, providing for the permanent improvement of certain streets and avenues in the City of Nitro, West Virginia, and providing for the assessment of abutting property and owners thereof.

Councilman Keener entered motion that the ordinance be tabled and brought up at the next regular session of council for its second reading and to be voted on for adoption or rejection. Motion seconded by councilman Ellis and upon vote by council was declared carried.

Councilman Ellis presented an ordinance providing for the permanent improvement of certain streets and avenues in the City of Nitro, West Virginia, by grading, paving, curbing and guttering the same with rock base, amistite or black top surface and concrete curbing and guttering, as ordinance and providing for the assessment of abutting property and the owners thereof for the costs of such improvements of said streets and avenues.

The question of increasing salary of I. E. Ellis, Fire Chief, was discussed by councilman Reynolds with the Mayor and members of council. No action taken at this time.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Chapman.

City Attorney Caldwell presented the following Resolution to Council:

A RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR THE ASSESSING AGAINST ABUTTING PROPERTY AND THE OWNERS THEREOF PART OF THE COSTS OF PAVING AND OTHERWISE PERMANENTLY IMPROVING PARTS OF 22ND STREET, 20TH STREET, 16TH STREET, 17TH STREET, 15TH STREET AND 13TH STREET IN THE CITY OF NITRO, WEST VIRGINIA.

WHEREAS, for the paving and otherwise permanently improving of streets in the City of Nitro all funds available to the City for the paving and such other permanent improvements from the proceeds of any bond issues had been exhausted by the use of said funds for the purposes for which said bond issues were authorized and made, and

WHEREAS, Fetitions in writing of persons owning the greater frontage abutting on both sides of the streets hereinafter mentioned between the respective intersections hereinafter mentioned had been received, filed, accepted and approved by this Council for the grading, paving, curbing, guttering and otherwise improving said streets as shown on the Engineer's report hereinafter set forth, and

WHEREAS, At a regular meeting of this Council on September 17, 1940, the said Council by a lawful majority of all elected members and by unanimous action of all those present at said meeting, adopted Ordinance No. 50 of this City, entitled "An Ordinance Providing for the Permanent Improvement of Certain Streets and Avenues in the City of Nitro, West Virginia by Grading, Curbing and Paving the Same with Rock Base and Amiesite or Black Top Surface as Set Forth in Said Ordinance, and Providing for the Assessment of Abutting Property and the Owners thereof for the Costs of such improvements of said Streets and Avenues", and

WHEREAS, Plans, specifications and estimates of said improvements were made by the City Engineer and approved by the Works Projects Administration, an agency of the Government of the United States of America, the particular section number of the Works Projects Administration being listed and set forth with the streets hereinafter listed and set forth, and

WHEREAS, Subsequent to the passage of said Ordinance No. 50 and prior to any work being done on or under any of said improvements, and before any expense was incurred or any contract for materials entered into to be used in the improvements, there was entered into between the City of Nitro and Nathan S. Poffenbarger, a bona fide and binding agreement between the City of Nitro and said individual for the purchase by said individual of assessment lien certificates to be issued in respect to said projects as provided in Section 8 of Chapter 92 of the Acts of the Legislature of West Virginia of 1939 as amended by the Acts of the Legislature of 1941, for the purpose of enabling the City of Nitro to effect the desired improvements and to prevent the City from incurring debts for that part of the expense to be borne by it unless and until it has been assured that the certificates for the particular project could be sold, and

WHEREAS, Advertisement was made according to law and said Ordinance for the bids for the furnishing of all necessary incidental materials and supplies, and such materials and supplies purchased from the lowest bidder after the approval of this Council, and

WHEREAS, Such paving and other improvements have been made and completed on the streets hereinafter listed in accordance with said petitions, said projects or section numbers, said Ordinance and according to law, and under the supervision and direction of the Works Projects Administration and of the Mayor and City Engineer of the City of Nitro, and

WHEREAS, the said improvements have been completed as hereinafter mentioned and provided for in said Ordinance No. 50 and according to law, and the said Engineer has prepared and certified to the Common Council of this City his report as hereinafter appears, and

WHEREAS, it appears to the Council independently of the aforesaid mentioned Engineer's report as hereinafter listed and set forth, that the permanent improvements have been completed in accordance with the ordinance heretofore adopted on the 17th day of September, 1940, and have specifically benefitted all of the property abutting on said streets improved, and the report, therefore, should be accepted and the property and the owners thereof specially assessed as shown in said Engineer's report.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NITRO:

l. The grading, paving, curbing, guttering and otherwise permanent improvement of the following named streets between the following intersections respectively on said streets are hereby declared to be completed in accordance with said petitions, projects or sections, Ordinance No. 50, and according to law, and are hereby accepted:

- (a) On 22nd Street, between the intersections of First and Second Avenues, being Works Projects Administration Section No. 21;
- (b) On 20th Street between the intersection of First and Second Avenues, being Works Projects Administration Section No. 33;
- (c) On 16th Street between the intersection of First and Second Avenues, being Works Projects Administration Section No. 19;
- (d) On 17th Street between the intersection of First and Second Avenues, being Works Projects Administration Section No. 16;
- (e) On 15th Street between the intersection of Second and Third Avenue, being Works Projects Administration Section No. 35;
- (f) On 13th Street between the intersection of Second and Third Avenues, and being Works Projects Administration Section No. 34.
- 2. It is now hereby declared that such assessments shall be due and payable in five equal installments, the first due and payable six months after the date of this ordinance, and the other four installments payable respectively in one year and six months, two years and six months, three years and six months, and four years and six months after the date of this ordinance, such assessments and each installment thereof to bear interest at the rate of 5% per annum until the due date of the respective installments, and thereafter at the rate of 6% per annum; provided that in case any property owner shall pay the entire assessment against his property within thirty days from the date of the assessment he shall not be charged interest thereon from the time subsequent to this date. The owner of any property against which any assessment is made who has not paid such assessment in full within thirty days from this date may pay at any time thereafter the whole of such assessments, or the whole of any installment thereof, with interest to the time of payment. The sum or sums of money assessed, together with the interest thereon, are hereby constituted and declared to be liens upon the several lots or fractional parts of lots abutting upon the street or streets, or alley or alleys, improved, which liens shall be effective from this date, and shall have priority over all other liens except those for taxes.
- 3. The report of the City Engineer, as follows, after examination by this Council, is hereby approved and adopted and the amounts therein set forth to be assessed against

the respective property and the owners thereof shown in said report, being the proper and correct amounts to be assessed after having made due and proper allowance and deduction for all money, work, labor or material furnished by the Works Projects Administration, are hereby assessed against the respective property and the owners thereof, subject only to such supervision, review and correction as may be made by this Council prior to said assessments becoming final as hereinafter set forth in this ordinance:





Mayor Chapman read letter to Council written by J. M. Carpenter concerning the deeding of a strip of the Carpenter property to the City of Nitro.

Councilman Draper entered motion that a more qualified man be employed as patrolman to replace John Rush, and that the services of John Rush be terminated as of May 1, 1942, motion seconded by councilman Reynolds and upon vote by council was declared carried.

Councilman Draper offered the following Resolution:

"I, Hugh Draper, move that the following Resolution be adopted":

"Whereas, The City of Nitro shall hold an election of officers on the Second day of June, 1942, as provided by Section 4, Article 3, Chapter 8, code of 1931, State of West Virginia; therefore be it:

"Resolved; That all nominations be made by certificate, and signed by the required number of voters, and filed with the City Recorder not later than the Second day of May, 1942, as provided by Section 16, Article 3, Chapter 8, Code of 1931, State of West Virginia".

"Be it further Resolved: That each candidate shall pay the sum of FIVE DOLLARS, (\$5.00), at time of filing certificate with the Recorder, said sum to be entered in the General Receipts of the City of Nitro".

"Be it further Resolved: That the Registrars, after having completed the registration, shall for the purpose of amending, correcting and completing such registration, sit to-gether at the City Office for TWO days, commencing on the Second Monday in May next".

"Be it further Resolved: That the election shall be held in the building known as the West Virginia Water Service Company building in the section occupied by the Boy Scouts of America".

Councilman Reynolds seconded motion and upon vote by council motion was declared carried.

The council made the following appointments for the registration of voters in the City election to be held June 2, 1942.

Mrs. Marie Blake, R. Alternate: Mrs. Harry Cochran, R. Mrs. Hazel Hayes, D. "Eugene Fowler, D.

Mayor Chapman declared meeting in recess until 7-30 P.M. Apr. 28.

The Council assembled on the 30th day of April, 1942, to continue business of recessed meeting of April 23rd; present were:

Lloyd M. Chapman, Mayor, T. A. Lewis, Recorder, and Henry Pauley; Ray W. Ellis; Frank Keener; Hugh Draper, members of Council of said city, and Chas. W. Caldwell, City Attorney.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Chapman.

Attorney Caldwell explained to Council the method of publication of street improvements and when and how the certificates can be taken up and paid for.

Attorney Caldwell presented Resolution to Council governing street improvements on Third Avenue; 31st Street and 34th Street.

Councilman Ellis entered motion that resolution be adopted, motion seconded by councilman Pauley and upon vote by Council was declared carried by a unanimous vote.

The Resolution is as follows:

A RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR THE ASSESSING AGAINST ABUTTING PROPERTY AND THE OWNERS THEREOF PART OF THE COSTS OF PAVING AND OTHERWISE PERMANENTLY IMPROVING PARTS OF THIRD AVENUE, 34TH STREET, AND 31ST STREET, IN THE CITY OF NITRO, WEST VIRGINIA.

WHEREAS, for the paving and otherwise permanently improving of streets in the City of Nitro all funds available to the City for the paving and such other permanent improvements from the proceeds of any bond issues had been exhausted by the use of said funds for the purposes for which said bond issues were authorized and made, and

WHEREAS, Petitions in writing of persons owning the greater frontage abutting on both sides of the streets hereinafter mentioned between the respective intersections hereinafter mentioned had been received, filed, accepted and approved by this Council for the grading, paving, curbing, guttering and otherwise improving said streets as shown on the Engineer's report hereinafter set forth, and

WHEREAS, At a regular meeting of this Council on September 17, 1940, the said Council by a lawful majority of all elected members and by unanimous action of all those present at said meeting, adopted Ordinance No. 50 of this City, entitled "An Ordinance Providing for the Permanent Improvement of Certain Streets and Avenues in the City of Nitro, West Virginia by Grading, Curbing and Paving the Same with Rock Base and Amiesite

or Black Top Surface as Set Forth in Said Ordinance, and Providing for the Assessment of Abutting Property and the Owners thereof for the Costs of such improvements of said Streets and Avenues," and

WHEREAS, Plans, specifications and estimates of said improvements were made by the City Engineer and approved by the Works Projects Administration, an agency of the Government of the United States of America, the particular section number of the Works Projects Administration being listed and set forth with the streets hereinafter listed and set forth, and

WHEREAS, Subsequent to the passage of said Ordinance No. 50 and prior to any work being done on or under any of said improvements, and before any expense was incurred or any contract for materials entered into to be used in the improvements, there was entered into between the City of Nitro and Nathan S. Poffenbarger, a bona fide and binding agreement between the City of Nitro and said individual for the purchase by said individual of assessment lien certificates to be issued in respect to said projects as provided in Section 8 of Chapter 92 of the Acts of the Legislature of West Virginia of 1939 as amended by the Acts of the Legislature of 1941, for the purpose of enabling the City of Nitro to effect the desired improvements and to prevent the City from incurring debts for that part of the expense to be borne by it unless and until it has been assured that the certificates for the particular project could be sold, and

WHEREAS, Advertisement was made according to law and said Ordinance for the bids for the furnishing of all necessary incidental materials and supplies, and such materials and supplies purchased from the lowest bidder after the approval of this Council, and

WHEREAS, Such paving and other improvements have been made and completed on the streets hereinafter listed in accordance with said petitions, said projects or section numbers, said Ordinance and according to law, and under the supervision and direction of the Works Projects Administration and of the Mayor and City Engineer of the City of Nitro, and

WHEREAS, the said improvements have been completed as hereinafter mentioned and provided for in said Ordinance No. 50 and according to law, and the said Engineer has prepared and certified to the Common Council of this City his report as hereinafter appears, and

WHEREAS, it appears to the Council independently of the aforesaid mentioned Engineer's report as hereinafter listed and set forth, that the permanent improvements have been completed in accordance with the ordinance heretofore adopted on the 17th day of September, 1940, and have specifically benefited all of the property abutting on said streets improved, and the report, therefore, should be accepted and the property and the owners thereof specially assessed as shown in said Engineer's report.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NITRO:

- 1. The grading, paving, curbing, guttering and otherwise permanent improvement of the following named streets between the following intersections respectively on said streets are hereby declared to be completed in accordance with said petitions, projects or sections, Ordinance No. 50, and according to law, and are hereby accepted:
- (a) On Third Avenue, between the intersections of 21st Street and 31st Street, being Works Projects Administration Section Nos. 2 and 31;
- (b) On 31st Street, between the intersections of First Avenue and Second Avenue, being Works Projects Administration Section No. 8;
- (c) On 34th Street, between the intersections of First Avenue and Second Avenue, being Works Projects Administration Section No. 18.
- 2. It is now hereby declared that such assessments shall be due and payable in five equal installments, the first due and payable six months after the date of this Resolution, and the other four installments payable respectively in one year and six months, two years and six months, three years and six months, and four years and six months after the date of this Resolution, such assessments and each installment thereof to bear interest at the rate of 5% per annum until the due date of the respective installments, and thereafter at the rate of 6% per annum; provided that in case any property owner shall pay the entire assessment against his property within thirty days from the date of the assessment he shall not be charged interest thereon from the time subsequent to this date. The owner of any property against which any assessment is made who has not paid such assessment in full within thirty days from this date may pay at any time thereafter the whole of such assessments. or the whole of any installment thereof, with interest to the time of payment. The sum or sums of money assessed, together with the interest thereon, are hereby constituted and declared to be liens upon the several lots or fractional parts of lots abutting upon the street or streets, or alley or alleys, improved, which liens shall be effective from this date, and shall have priority over all other liens except those for taxes.
  - 3. The report of the City Engineer, as follows, after examination by this Council, is hereby approved and adopted and the amounts therein set forth to be assessed against the respective property and the owners thereof shown in said report, being the proper and correct amounts to be assessed after having made due and proper allowance and deduction for all money, work, labor or material furnished by the Works Projects Administration, are hereby assessed against the respective property and the owners

thereof, subject only to such supervision, review and correction as may be made by this Council prior to said assessments becoming final as hereinafter set forth in this ordinance:

### ENGINEER'S REPORT

TO THE HONORABLE MAYOR AND THE CORMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NITRO, WEST VIRGINIA:

I hereby certify and report that the total cost for the permanent improvements on the following named streets: (a) Third Avenue between the intersections of 21st Street and 31st Street, grading and paving; (b) 31st Street between the intersections of First Avenue and Second Avenue, curbing and guttering; (c) 34th Street between the intersections of First Avenue and Second Avenue, grading, paving, curbing and guttering; was \$22,193.12 for Third Avenue, and of this amount the W. P. A. contributed the sum of \$16,932.11, and the net cost to be apportioned to and be assessed against the owners and the property abutting upon said Avenue is \$5,261.01; was \$1,291.93 for 31st Street, and of this amount the W. P. A. contributed the sum of \$690.69, and that the net cost to be apportioned to and be assessed against the owners and the property abutting upon said Street is \$601.24; was \$3,947.87 for 34th Street, and of this amount the W. P. A. contributed the sum of \$2,390.51, and that the net cost to be apportioned to and assessed against the owners and the property abutting upon said Street is \$1,557.36; that the descriptions of the lots or fractional parts of lots, or tracts of land, as to location, frontage, and the owners thereof, liable for the respective net costs of such permanent improvements are hereafter correctly set forth, and that the proportionate share of the net costs that should be assessed against each of the respective owners and the respective properties abutting upon the said streets is hereinafter correctly shown, and that the amounts have been apportioned in proportion to the distance for which any particular lot abuts upon the respective street bears to the total length of said street improvement, including intersections, and have been calculated and charged accordingly; and that the number of feet embraced in street or alley intersection is hereinafter correctly shown; that said streets were permanently improved in accordance with the provisions of the Ordinance relative thereto adopted by the Council on the 17th day of September, 1940, and in accordance with the plans and specifications therefor, and as approved by the Works Projects Administration; and that said permanent improvements have been completed and are ready for acceptance and assessment by the Council as follows:

All of said lots, tracts, parcels of real estate for 31st Street and 34th Street are located in the City of Nitro and are shown upon the map of said City duly filed and recorded in the office of the Clerk of the County Court of Kanawha County, West Virginia, and also in the office of the Clerk of the County

Court of Putnam County, West Virginia; and all of said lots, tracts or parcels of real estate for Third Avenue are shown upon a map entitled "Map showing property assessed for permanent improvement of Third Avenue between 21st Street and 31st Street in the City of Nitro, West Virginia, made by C. The sums so assessed as in said reports set forth as a part of the foregoing section, and all interest on said sums, are hereby declared to be liens upon the abutting lots or fractional parts thereof and other lots abutting thereon, such liens to be effective from this date and to have priority over all other liens except those for taxes.



Mr. O. B. Chamberlain appeared before the Council in regard to the footage he was charged with and cost of same on the Blakes Creek bridge. Attorney Caldwell explained to Mr. Chamberlain that all costs were added into a lump sum and each property owner assessed there proportinate part of the total cost according to the footage owned by them.

Councilman Keener entered motion that the aforementioned resolution in regard to the permanent improvement of Third Avenue; 31st Street and 34th Street be accepted and adopted, motion seconded by councilman Reynolds and upon vote by Council was declared carried.



Councilman Erwin entered motion that James E. Roark be reappoined as Building Inspector, motion seconded by councilman Keener and upon vote by Council was declared carried.

Mayor Chapman recommended to Council that 1 pair of handcuffs and a spot-light be purchased for the police department. Councilman Grass entered motion that these items be purchased,

motion seconded by councilman Keener and upon vote by Council was declared carried.

Mayor Chapman declared meeting in recess until 7-30 e-clock P. M. August 4, 1942.
