I have been working on behalf of Bill Fortune and the Nitro Food Pantry to help procure funding for the installation of a generator system to secure their frozen food stock in the event of power failures. Which have recently resulted in massive losses in inventory.

Currently, the Nitro Food Pantry, housed in the Nitro West Sattess Community Center, functions as an all-volunteer organization. They operate approximately on a budget of \$35,000 yearly. They have over 5,000 annual clients who receive services. Additionally, the pantry also runs a take home food backpack program for both Nitro Elementary Students and Rock Branch Elementary which serves 150 students weekly.

Mr. Fortune, who is the long-term volunteer director of the food pantry has obtained a quote from Montori Mechanical Group to install the necessary generator system for \$21,640.

It is my general understanding based on conversations with all the stakeholders that the funding for this project will be obtained through the following donations:

Kanawha County Commission: \$5,000

Ledya Funds from Delegate Andy Shamblin: \$1,500

Ledya Funds from Delegate Walter Hall \$1,000

The City of Nitro invites qualified vendors to submit proposals for the lease and potential purchase of four 240 kW DC fast-charging electric vehicle stations. These stations, to be installed within one mile of the I-64 exit, will support the city's clean energy initiatives and enhance our infrastructure for electric vehicle users.

Vendors will be responsible for the installation, maintenance, and support of the stations. Proposals should include lease terms, costs, and an option-to-buy plan. Submission deadline is August 16, 2024. Proposals will be reviewed at a regular meeting of the City Council on Tuesday, August 20 at 7:00 PM.

ORDINANCE _____

An ordinance to amend and reenact Section 70.166, Chapter 70 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Nitro, West Virginia, as amended, all relating to driving a vehicle through a safety zone, traffic regulations, and establishing penalties for violations of Section 70.166.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NITRO, WEST VIRGINIA, that Section 70.166, Chapter 70 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Nitro, West Virginia, as amended, be amended and reenacted, all to read as follows:

§ 70.166 DRIVING THROUGH SAFETY ZONE.

(A) No operator of a vehicle shall drive the same over or through a safety zone.

(B) Any person violating the provisions of this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not more than \$100; upon a second conviction within one year thereafter, shall be fined not more than \$200; and upon a third or subsequent conviction, shall be fined not more than \$500. Court Costs as determined by the Court shall be added to each conviction.

ORDINANCE _____

An ordinance to amend and reenact Section 70.167, Chapter 70 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Nitro, West Virginia, as amended, all relating to driving on streets posted as closed for repairs, traffic regulation, and establishing penalties for violations of Section 70.167.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NITRO, WEST VIRGINIA, that Section 70.167, Chapter 70 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Nitro, West Virginia, as amended, be amended and reenacted, all to read as follows:

§ 70.167 DRIVING UPON STREET POSTED AS CLOSED FOR REPAIR.

(A) No person shall drive upon, along or across a street or highway, or any part thereof, which has been closed in the process of its construction, reconstruction or repair, and posted with appropriate signs by the authority having jurisdiction to close such street or highway.

(B) Any person violating the provisions of this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not more than \$100; upon a second conviction within one year thereafter, shall be fined not more than \$200; and upon a third or subsequent conviction, shall be fined not more than \$500. Court Costs as determined by the Court shall be added to each conviction.

ORDINANCE _____

An ordinance to amend and reenact Chapter 70, Section 70.168 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Nitro, West Virginia, as amended, all relating to traffic regulations, obstruction of traffic, and establishing penalties for violations of Section 70.168.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NITRO, WEST VIRGINIA, that Chapter 70, Section 70.168 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Nitro, West Virginia, as amended, be amended and reenacted, all to read as follows:

§ 70.168 OBSTRUCTION OF TRAFFIC.

(A) No person shall operate, stop, stand or park any motor vehicle on any street or alley within the municipality so as to obstruct or hinder the free flow of motor vehicle traffic except in compliance with a lawful order of a police officer or in compliance with a traffic control sign, signal or marking.

(B) Any person violating the provisions of this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not more than \$100; upon a second conviction within one year thereafter, shall be fined not more than \$200; and upon a third or subsequent conviction, shall be fined not more than \$500. Court Costs as determined by the Court shall be added to each conviction.

ORDINANCE _____

An ordinance to amend and reenact Chapter 70, Section 70.169 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Nitro, West Virginia, as amended, relating to traffic regulation, vehicle security, and establishing penalties for violations of Section 70.169.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NITRO, WEST VIRGINIA, that Chapter 70, Section 70.169 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Nitro, West Virginia, as amended, be amended and reenacted, all to read as follows:

§ 70.169 VEHICLE SECURITY.

(A) Every owner or registrant of a motor vehicle shall maintain security upon such vehicle as required by W. Va. Code Article 17D-2A, and no person shall knowingly drive or operate on any street within the municipality any motor vehicle upon which security is required by such Article unless the security is provided, and violation of any of the provisions of W. Va. Code Article 17D-2A, including failure to have a certificate of insurance, if required, shall constitute a violation under this section.

(B) Any person violating the provisions of this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not more than \$500 or imprisoned no more than thirty days, or both fined and imprisoned. Court Costs as determined by the Court shall be added to each conviction.

ORDINANCE _____

An ordinance to amend and reenact Chapter 70, Section 70.170 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Nitro, West Virginia, as amended, all relating to traffic regulation, littering from a motor vehicle, and establishing penalties for violations of Section 70.170.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NITRO, WEST VIRGINIA, that Chapter 70, Section 70.170 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Nitro, West Virginia, as amended, be amended and reenacted, all to read as follows:

§ 70.170 LITTERING FROM A MOTOR VEHICLE.

(A) It is unlawful for any driver or passenger of a motor vehicle or other conveyance to place, deposit, dump, throw or cause to be placed, deposited, dumped or thrown, any litter from a motor vehicle or other conveyance in or upon any public or private highway, road, street or alley; any private property; any public property; or the waters of the state or within 100 feet of the waters of this state, except in a proper litter or other solid waste receptacle.

(B) For purposes of this section, litter means all waste material including, but not limited to, any garbage, refuse, trash, disposable package, container, can, bottle, paper, ashes, cigarette or cigar butt, carcass of any dead animal or any part thereof, or any other offensive or unsightly matter, but not including the wastes of primary processes of mining, logging, saw milling, farming or manufacturing.

(C) When there is more than one occupant in a motor vehicle or other conveyance and it cannot be determined which occupant is responsible for violating this section, the driver shall be presumed to be responsible for the violation.

(D) Any person violating the provisions of this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not more than \$100; upon a second conviction within one year thereafter, shall be fined not more than \$200; and upon a third or subsequent conviction, shall be fined not more than \$500. Court Costs as determined by the Court shall be added to each conviction.

ORDINANCE _____

An ordinance to amend and reenact Chapter 70, Section 70.187 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Nitro, West Virginia, as amended, relating to traffic regulations, obedience to police officers, and establishing penalties for violation Section 70.187.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NITRO, WEST VIRGINIA, that Chapter 70, Section 70.187 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Nitro, West Virginia, as amended, be amended and reenacted, all to read as follows:

§ 70.187 OBEDIENCE TO POLICE OFFICERS; FLEEING.

(A) No person shall willfully fail or refuse to comply with any lawful order or direction of any police officer or special officer invested by law with authority to direct, control or regulate traffic.

(B) No person shall operate a vehicle so as to willfully elude or flee a police officer or special officer after receiving a visible or audible signal from such an officer to bring his or her vehicle to a stop.

(C) Any person violating the provisions of this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not more than \$100; upon a second conviction within one year thereafter, shall be fined not more than \$200; and upon a third or subsequent conviction, shall be fined not more than \$500. Court Costs as determined by the Court shall be added to each conviction.
